MAKING AN IMPACT: BIRMINGHAM (AL) CHAPTER PUSH VOTER REGISTRATION

The Birmingham (AL) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated recently partnered with Black Votes Matter to provide voter education and registration information to students at Lawson State Community College. The event was part of the national observance of Voter Registration Impact Day on September 17, 2024.

At the event, students participated in an interactive session about the importance of voting. Eligible citizens also were able to register to vote. Additionally, the students were encouraged to develop a plan of action for voting in all elections. The students also experienced a surprise visit and discussion with “foot soldiers” in Alabama whose front-line efforts during the civil rights movement impacted voting and other freedoms in the south.

Hosted by the National Trends and Services Facet, the program was presented as part of Link Up the Vote, a national initiative of The Links, Incorporated that focuses on four key topics: voter identification, voter registration, voter information, and voter activation.

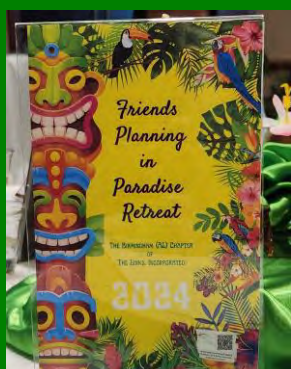
